English Language Arts (ELA)

- Students will continue to receive spelling words in their agenda and will be posted on Google Classroom.
- We are currently examining how the form and structure of texts can support the communication of ideas and information for a variety of purposes, including to inform, persuade, and provide enjoyment. This includes looking at the genre of different texts and understanding that narrative texts can be fiction or nonfiction and follow a particular structure.
- Students are encouraged to read at home and practice spelling words daily.
