### Classroom News

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### Mrs. Clark's MATH Corner

In Math 6, we have wrapped up the Algebra unit and we are advancing to the topic of Fractions. We will be learning lots of new vocabulary like imperfect and mixed fractions. We will also be making connections between Fractions and the topics of ratios, decimals, and percent.

As has often been the case this year, we will be learning the grade 5 new curriculum first before we can address the grade 6 new curriculum content.

We will look at biblical understanding of the concept of parts and whole. We will also tell a few bad fraction jokes this month:

"I had a big argument with my friend about fractions....our opinions were divided."

#### **Social Studies**

Our study of Athens is going well, and students have gained a lot of knowledge in regards to the social structure of this ancient society. This month, we will learn about their form of democracy and compare it to our modern form. Following this, we will be moving on to examine the Iroquois Confederacy, comparing and contrasting it to both Ancient Athens and our modern governmental systems.

# Science

We have begun our exploration of Flight in Science. Students will be building, testing and adapting different flying contraptions. I know that students will really enjoy these activities! I am also working on arranging a small field trip to the airport to see some airplanes up close and personal.

By the end of the month, we will be moving on to explore Evidence and Investigation. This is a fun unit focusing on basic forensics.
