We will be wrapping up the Algebra unit soon with the topic of the <u>distributive property</u>. Students can expect one last smaller assessment around the second week of April.

Next, we will be studying <u>Patterns and Equations</u>, which is actually making connections between units that we have already covered: equations with variables and graphing coordinates.

In regards to connecting our faith and math studies, one of my favorite comments from students is: "Wow, it's all connected!" They are referring to the connection between math units, how Math applies to everyday life, and how God has made creation to have measurable patterns.

Social Studies

This month, we will be exploring Ancient Athens. As we do, students will be learning about daily life and their model of democracy. Students will be examining this society through the lens of Justice-Seekers & Community-Builders, seeking to understand and evaluate their model of democracy and how it relates to our current model.
